Read: John 1:1-14

What do these verse from John's Gospel affirm about Jesus' identity? Some people claim that Jesus was not actually a real historical person. If Jesus was completely human, what facts about Him must be true? Why is it necessary for people to understand that Jesus was fully human?

The Hebrew word for "tabernacle" is related to the Greek that is rendered "took up residence" in verse 14. How does Jesus take up residence within us? How does Jesus enable us to enter God's most holy place? The Israelites witnessed the glory of God in the Tabernacle. How do we observe God's glory in His "tabernacle" today?

How do we see this glory in our fellow believers? What does it mean that Jesus is full of grace and truth? How did Jesus bring grace and truth by coming to earth? As those sent by Jesus today, what does it mean for us to live full of grace and truth? Why is this an essential component of our mission at His followers?
